

Parent Consultation Evenings

It was lovely to see so many of you of you again, this week, for your children's parent consultation meeting. We hope you found these meetings helpful, and you had time to look at you children's work in their books and around the school, on our wonderful displays. I hope you are feeling rightly proud of everything your child is achieving at our school.

Maths Mastery



Mastering maths means the children acquire a deep, long-term, secure, and adaptable understanding of the subject. The phrase 'teaching for mastery' describes the elements of classroom practice we use to give pupils the best chances of mastering maths. Achieving mastery means acquiring a solid enough understanding of the maths being taught so the children are able to move on to more advanced material.

As you may know, at Cann Hall, we deliver our mathematics curriculum through the 'Mastery Approach' and we are currently in the 'embedding' year of this programme. Part of this programme means that the school has regular access to a designated mastery specialist. On Monday, she visited the school and carried out a learning walk in every year group and her feedback was extremely positive.

She said the mathematical language the children are using, across the school was 'phenomenal'. She was very impressed with how we use multiple representations (conceptual variation) to enable all children to access the mathematics being taught and develop their understanding. She was also really impressed with how we develop our maths working walls to support the children, with their learning. Another thing she was very impressed with, was how our teachers always encourage the children to prove how they know an answer is correct, as this really helps to deepen their understanding.

From her visit, she is now planning to bring teachers from other schools, who are also on this programme, to Cann Hall to observe how we apply the maths mastery approach here!



School Dinner Payments – Important Changes

We need to inform you that **dinner balances will now need to have a minimum of £2 credit** to cover the cost of your child's meal. Dinners will <u>no longer</u> be allowed to be paid retrospectively so please can ensure you are regularly checking and topping up your child's dinner credit on your 'My Child at School' app. If you have any queries, please contact the school office.

Inconsiderate Parking - Polite Request



Unfortunately, we have received complaints this week from local residents, who have been unable to park on their own driveways. This is because parents/carers, are parking, without any consideration, across their drives, when dropping off and collecting their children from school.

When residents have approached the owners of these cars and asked them to move, we've been informed that the responses have left a lot to be desired!

According to the Highway Code, it's an offence to park across driveways, and it's illegal to park over dropped kerbs – even a little bit. When dropping off and collecting your children from school, please do not park across our neighbours' driveways, in the future, and also not on the zigzag lines outside the school.

Staff Car Park

We are once again having to share our concerns about the number of parents, carers and children (who are often unsupervised), walking through our staff car park.

To keep everyone safe, the front car park gates will be closed at the beginning and end of the school day. Only parents and carers, who have a pre-arranged agreement, are permitted to open, and drive through these gates.



We do have an entrance gate at the back of the car park. To safely access this there is a pathway, which runs from the main front gate, past the office and kitchen, which then takes you through a cordoned off section of the car park. If this situation does not improve then we will be forced to stop using these gates as one of our entrances.

Emergency Services Day



An Emergency Services Day at Clacton Police Station is being held on **Saturday 25 March from 11am to 2pm**.

Join the District Commander, Chief Inspector Ella Latham, and her team at their Police station on Beatrice Road and meet the people who work to keep our community safe.

There'll be lots of police-themed activities for the younger members of the community to get involved in as well as demonstrations from some of their specialist policing teams. They'll be giving an insight into their work and the type of equipment they use to protect people in Essex and catch criminals. And of course, they will have different Essex Police vehicles on hand for people to get a closer look at plus some police uniform to try on too.

They will also be joined by their emergency colleagues including Essex County Fire and Rescue Service, HM Coastguard, RSPCA and Safer Essex Roads Partnership as well as several charitable organisations that they regularly work with such as Next Chapter, CVST, NHW and United in Kind.

No booking needed. Refreshments will be available to purchase on the day, with all profits going to support local charities. Parking isn't available at the police station or on Beatrice Road, but there are several public car parks just a short walk from the station.

Pupil Premium Eligibility Check

Another reminder that if you think your child might be entitled to pupil premium, we can help you by carrying out an eligibility check. All you need to do is bring your **name**, **date of birth and national insurance number** to the school office.

Pupil premium entitles pupils to free school meals, support with the purchase of school uniform, help towards the cost of school trips, access to breakfast club and lots more.

It also helps us, as a school, to access additional specialist resources to support the children. Just pop into the school office, when you are free, and let us check for you.



Mother's Day

A reminder that with Mother's Day fast approaching, the PTA are organising a 'pop up' shop, that

Breakfast club

As we mentioned last week, if your child has been invited to join us at breakfast club but has not yet attended, please encourage them to come and give it a try. It is run every day, by Mrs McWilliams, from 8.15-8.30pm. If your child hasn't had an invite to breakfast club, but you are interested in finding out more about it, please contact Mr Smith or the school office.



School Age Team

A reminder that the School Age Team is made up of specialist community public health nurses, school nurses, and healthy family support practitioners, who all specialise in the delivery of care to school age children and young people.

They deliver health advice and support both within School, within the family home, our family hubs and delivery sites or other community settings.

The team can help with:

- Providing confidential drop-in sessions at every secondary school allowing young people to discuss any health or wellbeing concerns.
- Providing community drop-in sessions at family hubs and delivery sites.
- Providing support in key stages including school transition from primary to secondary, mid teen and year 11 help to ensure that young people are prepared for their next stage of life.
- Support with regard to common childhood issues (Bedwetting, diet, exercise, sleep and emotional wellbeing).
- Completing individual health needs assessments to identify any health and wellbeing needs, then putting support in place.
- Working alongside you to decide the best level of support.
- Working alongside other organisations when required to ensure the best possible outcome for you and your child.
- The school age team will accept self-referrals through school drop-in sessions, Parents, teachers, GP and other health care colleagues can refer through to the service by making contact- 0300 247 0015.

The school lunch that day will also be following a red theme!


Attendance Update

If your child's attendance falls below 96%, we require evidence to authorise any further absence. You can check your child's current attendance using the My Child at School App.

Lateness does also affect your child's attendance. Please try to ensure that your child arrives at school before the gates close, each morning at **8.40am**.
