
# **New Topics**



# **Attendance Update**



Our average attendance this week was 92.8%.

Our attendance is slowly improving so this term, please can you try to make even more of an effort to ensure that your child attends school every day. Doing this means they will have a better chance of being able to keep up with their learning, which will give them the best opportunity to do well in school and make progress. There are some great topics and activities planned, this term, so don't let your children miss out!

If your child's attendance falls below 90%, you will be sent a letter to alert you of this. When we feel it is necessary, home visits will also be arranged. If your child's attendance falls below **96%**, we will require evidence to authorise any further absence.

Lateness does also affect your child's

attendance. Please try to ensure that your child arrives at school before the gates close, each morning at **8.40am**.

You can check your child's current attendance using the 'My Child at School App'. If your child is unable to attend school, please ensure you call or email the school on the morning of **every day** they are absent. Thank you.

### Test of new UK Emergency Alerts service and our School Lockdown

The <u>Government's Emergency Alerts system</u> is now live. It will contact people via their mobile phone when lives are in danger. Alerts are a loud, siren-like sound with a message. They are sent to compatible mobile phones within an area of risk. They don't track your location, need your phone number, or collect personal data. Only emergency services can send them, and you can opt out. On Sunday 23 April 2023 there will be <u>a national test</u> of this system.

Linked to this, we have been reviewing our own emergency planning procedures. This afternoon the children had a 'lockdown' practice. The teachers prepared the children in readiness for this so that they knew exactly what to do. The alarm sound is different from the fire alarm, and once it sounds the teachers make sure that the classroom is secure and then they settle the children safely and quietly, until a member of the leadership team lets them know that it is safe again. We were really impressed with how the children managed this – they were so sensible, which made us very proud of them.

On Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> May, our small hall is being used as a polling station, which means that Chestnut Grove (breakfast and afterschool club) will be closed on this day.
