Year One are loving their learning in Art. They have been monoprinting, using Picasso's line drawings for inspiration.


What's being covered in PSHE at Cann Hall this Half Term?

In PSHE this half term Year One to Year Three are learning about **Relationships**. Year One are learning about people who care for us; groups we beong to and families. Year Two are learning about Friendships; feeling lonely and how to manage arguments. Year Three are also learning about Friendships, building on from their learning in Year Two, thinking about positive friendships, managing loneliness and dealing with arguments.

Year Four to Year Six are learning about **Health and Wellbeing**. Year Four are learning about feelings and emotions; expression of feelings and behaviour. Year Five are learning about identity; personal attributes and qualities; similarities and differences; individuality and stereotypes. Finally, Year Six are learning how to look after themselves; growing up; becoming independent and taking more responsibility.


PSHE lessons across the school are also supplemented with high quality texts and assemblies from the No Outsiders Programme.







<u>Attendance</u>



Our attendance has dipped quite a bit this week to 94.9%. We know there has been a bit of a stomach bug going around this week so we are hoping that this rises back up to good levels next week, as children return to school recovered.

Ensuring your child's regular attendance at school is a parent/carer's legal responsibility (section 444 of the 1996 Education Act) and permitting absence from school that is not authorised by the school creates an offence in law.

Our attendance ladder clearly shows what we expect in terms of good attendance at school, and our policy informs you further of what happens when attendance falls below certain levels. You can find a copy of our

policy on the <u>website</u>.

If your child's attendance falls below 90%, you will receive a letter to alert you of this and when we feel it is necessary, home visits will also be arranged. If your child's attendance falls below 96%, we will require evidence to authorise any further absence. Holidays will not be authorised.

Lateness also affects your child's attendance so please try to ensure that your child arrives at school before the gates close, each morning at 8.40am. You can check your child's current attendance using the 'My Child at School App'.

Secondary School Applications (Y6 Pupils)

A reminder that the new secondary school admission round opened on Tuesday, 12 September 2023, for parents and carers of current Year 6 children to apply for a secondary school (Year 7) place for September 2024.

The statutory national closing date for applications is 31 October 2023.

Applications can be made online via <u>www.essex.gov.uk/admissions</u> (99% of applications, last year were made online). The website also has a copy of the Secondary Education in Essex 2024-25 booklet which contains details of all secondary school admission policies.

Clacton Coastal Academy Open Evening (Y6 Pupils)



Here's another reminder that if you have a child, who is currently in Year 6, you are invited to an open evening at Clacton Coastal Academy, where you will be able to find out what the school can offer your children in Year 7.

The open evening is on Thursday 28th September

between 5pm and 7.30pm. There are two separate time slots available for parents and carers to attend the headteacher's welcome talk at 5.15pm and 6.15pm. After the welcome talk, you will have the opportunity to walk around the Academy and meet various departments and members of staff. There will be science experiments, sporting and musical activities. You will also have the opportunity to taste the excellent food, prepared by the school's caterers.

Pupil Premium Entitlement Reminder

All Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 children are entitled to Universal Free School Meals, so for the first few years of their school life, school meals are free. As well as this, families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for additional funding called **Pupil Premium**, which is used to support the children in school academically, towards trips, school uniform and clubs.

Your child would be eligible for this funding, if you receive any of the following benefits:

- Universal credit with an annual income of no more than £7,400 (after tax and before benefits)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than $\pounds 16,190$
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If you think your child could be eligible for this additional funding, please do contact the school office and we will be very happy to help you with the application form.

School Dinner Payment

If your child is in Years 3-6, you would like them to receive a school meal and they are not eligible to Pupil Premium, please ensure that there is sufficient credit in their dinner account, which is accessed through your **'My Child at School'** app. The cost of a school dinner is £2.30 per day. If you have any problems with accessing this app or payments, please pop into the office and we will be happy to help.

Essex ActivAte offer club spaces to primary and secondary school aged children (4-16 years), who are eligible for benefit based free school meals, or from 'low-income' working families, as well as children who may be vulnerable to inactivity or social isolation.

WHERE WILL THE CLUBS BE RUN?
