
Prizes will be drawn before we break up for the Christmas holiday.

#### **Year 4 Multiplication Times Tables Check**

In June, children in **Year 4**, across the country will sit the official multiplication timetables check (MTC). The MTC determines how well Year 4 children can fluently and accurately recall their multiplication tables up to 12x12.

The teachers, in every year group, plan in lessons dedicated to learning these important facts across the year. These lessons, as well as developing accuracy and fluency, give the children the opportunity to identify patterns and connections between the different timetables. We also encourage the children to regularly log on to either TT Rockstars or the White Rose 1-minute maths app, each day.



These digital programmes can be accessed at home so please encourage your children to log on each day at home too, even if they have logged on in school. The more opportunities the children are given to develop their accuracy with these




important facts the better. Once they have the accuracy then the speed of recall will follow. The class teacher will have your child's log in details, so please speak to them if you need a reminder of their details.

Another way we help prepare the Year 4 children for this official check, in June is to take part in TT Rockstars Tournaments and their Unofficial Official Multiplication Checks, across the year. The first TT Unofficial Check will be running from **January 15<sup>th</sup> to February 2<sup>nd</sup> 2024**. The Year 4 teachers will be writing to parents and carers with more details about this.

So that you feel more prepared to support your child with the Official Check in June, here is a link to a government publication for parents which includes everything you need to know about this check. 2024 multiplication tables check: information for parents (publishing.service.gov.uk) and of course please do not hesitate to speak to the Year 4 teachers, if you have any questions or concerns.

## IS MY CHILD ELIGIBLE?


