#### NSPCC Number Day



Don't forget, we are going to support the NSPCC again this year, by taking part in **their NSPCC Number Day on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> February**.

#### EYFS Maths

This week the children in EYFS have been looking at different ways to make 5. The children have used balancing scales, the 5 Little Speckled Frogs song, ladybirds and counters to explore the composition of five. They have even started to record their Maths too! This afternoon, the children have played some games, focusing on turn taking and sharing.







#### Year One Computing



The children in Year One have loved programming the Beebots, this week, inputting commands to direct their robots to reach different shapes on a grid.

#### Year 5 PSHE



As part of their work on health and wellbeing in PSHE, Year 5 have been learning how to treat shock.

The children have learnt that laying the affected person down with their legs raised helps maintain the blood flow to their vital organs and that covering them up with a blanket or coat helps to keep them warm.

#### NSPCC Campaign



You may have read in the media about the worrying increase in reported child abuse. The NSPCC have launched a campaign with the Home Office to tackle this and raise awareness of the helpline.

#### The NSPCC Helpline

<u>The Helpline</u> is a free advice line for any adult, including professionals, who has any concerns about a child.

Dedicated child protection specialists can give advice on a wide range of issues affecting children, as well as when child abuse is suspected. They also operate a dedicated <u>Whistleblowing Helpline</u>, which can be contacted for any concerns around child protection within the workplace, or other professional organisations.



They are encouraging any adult to use the Helpline to express any concerns they might have regarding a child, **even if they're not certain**. By doing this, everyone can play a part in helping keep children safe from abuse.



#### Attendance Update



Thank you for your on-going support and understanding, regarding the importance of your child being in school every day, when they are well. As we have said before, attending school regularly improves the life chances of children and young people. Being in school every day will improve health, wellbeing and socialisation throughout their life.

Our overall attendance again this week was **93.8%.** We are confident that with your support and once this bug season is behind us our attendance will improve even further.

NHS 'Is my child too ill for school?' guidance has further information.

We are aware that more children may be absent from school due to symptoms of

anxiety than before the pandemic. Worry and mild or moderate anxiety, whilst sometimes difficult emotions, can be a normal part of growing up for many children and young people. Being in school can often help alleviate the underlying issues. A prolonged period of absence is likely to heighten a child's anxiety about attending in the future, rather than reduce it. DfE has published useful guidance on mental health issues affecting a pupil's attendance and those who are experiencing persistent symptoms can be encouraged to access additional support.





Don't forget that lateness will affect your child's attendance record so please ensure that they are in school with everything they need for the day, before the gates close at 8.40am. This also allows the school office to complete crucial daily attendance checks and dinner registers, in good time.

#### What is Essex Activate?



Essex Activate is the name of a holiday and food programme, run by Essex County Council on behalf of the Department for Education.

#### Save Money - Free School Meals for every EYFS and KS1 Child

#### KS1 (Year 2) Sats Update

You may already be aware that the **Key Stage 1 SATs**, which are administered to children in Year 2, are no longer compulsory national tests and have now been replaced by optional KS1 SATS. As a school, we will be administering the optional tests to our Year 2 children, across the month of May.

You child's class teacher will give you more information nearer the time, but we just wanted to reassure you that the children will be fully prepared, and the tests will be administered in a relaxed and supportive way.




### WHERE WILL THE CLUBS BE RUN?
