No Pre-Ordering Trial Week - reminder



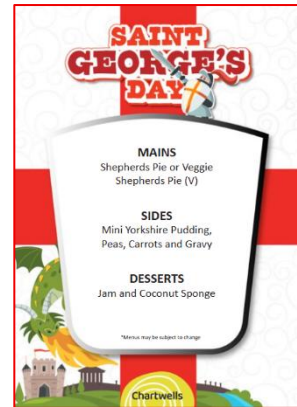
During the week commencing **Monday 23rd March**, Chartwells have asked us to trial how we get on **without** asking parents/carers to pre-order their child's school meal.

Chartwells will be preparing a special menu for the occasion (shown here) and we hope the children enjoy this 'one off' menu – it looks delicious!

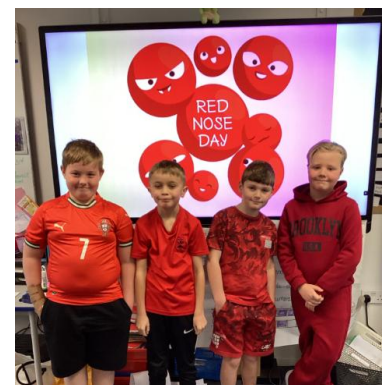


KS2 church visit reminder

Home visits are now carried out if a child has been absent for three days.

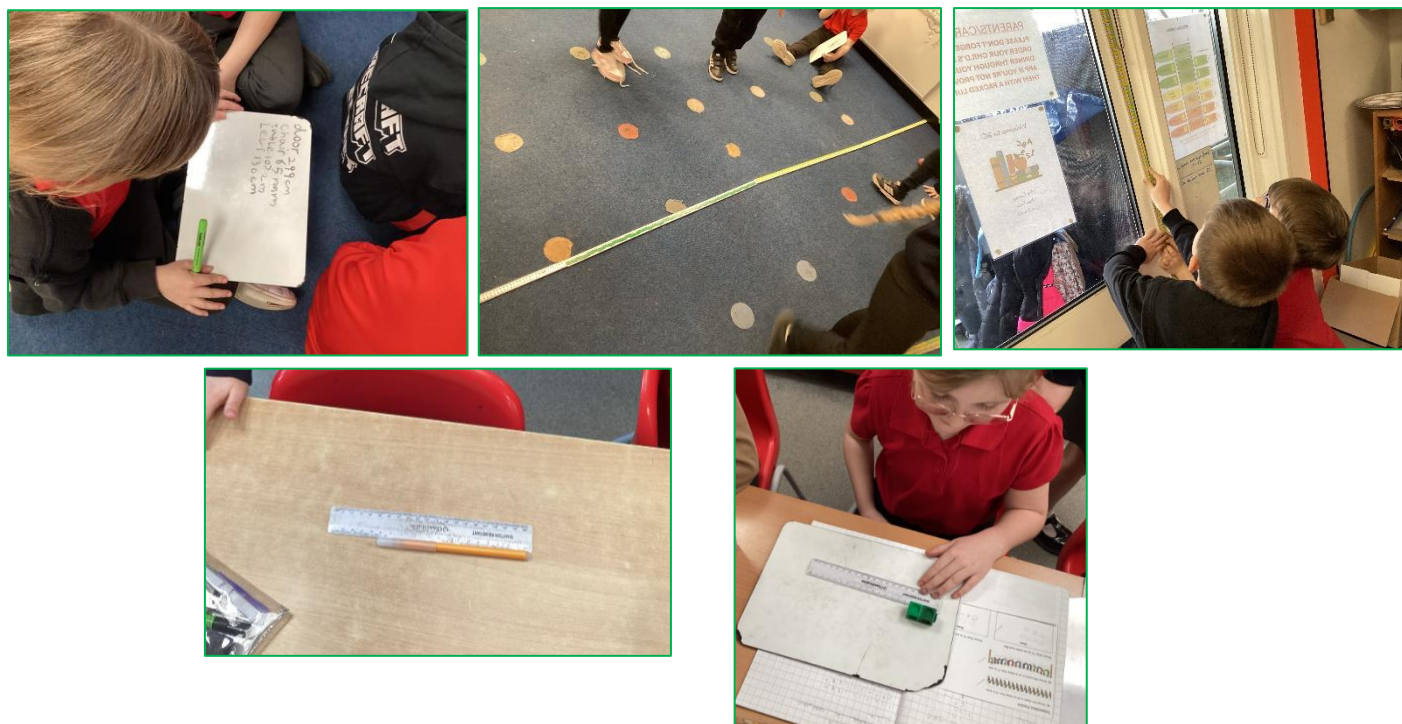
Learning

2C have also been measuring in centimetres and metres!



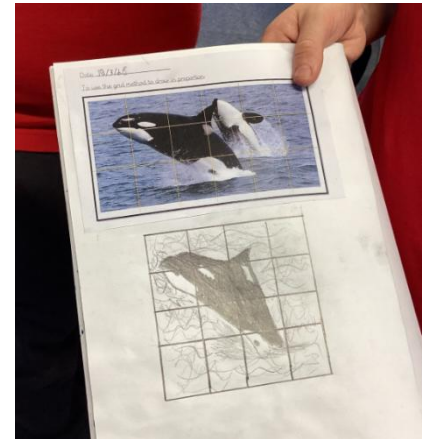
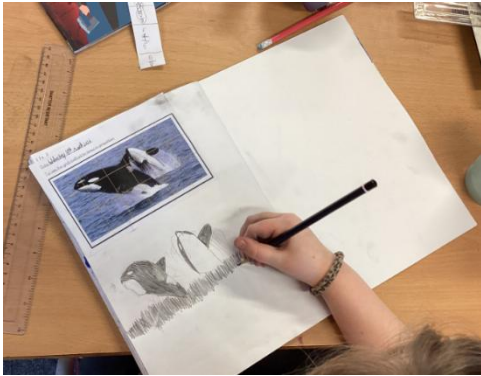
In History **3RW** explored why the Romans would have wanted to invade Colchester. They considered strategic location, noting its proximity to the sea and the presence of the River Colne. They also examined the defences of the Celtic people and discussed how these would have made an invasion challenging. The children then decided whether they were in favour of or against the invasion. As a class, they took on the role of Roman Advisors and attempted to persuade a Roman general to either proceed with or abandon invasion.



Also as part of their History, the children also explored the meaning of the word trade and discussed examples of trading in the modern world. They then learned about how the Romans used trade in Colchester, considering how these activities helped the town grow in wealth and importance. This led to a discussion about how trade contributed to Colchester becoming a powerful and significant settlement.

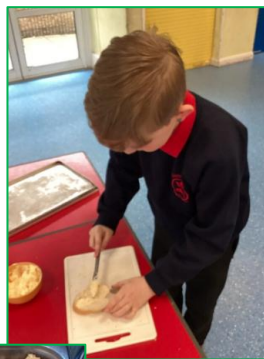
They then acted out being market traders explaining the item/s they are trading, why this item was important and how much this item cost.

4A have been developing their drawing skills, in Art. We used the grid method to help us draw in the correct proportions.

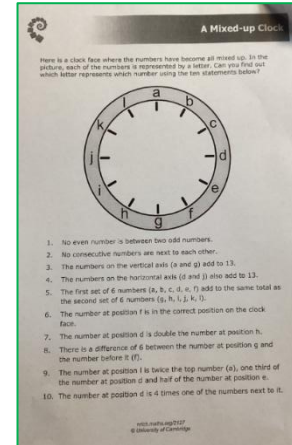

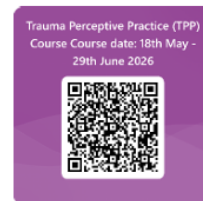
